<p>Emergency Shelters</p>	<p>Emergency shelters provide temporary housing for individuals or families who are homeless or who are fleeing dangerous situations. The Community Services and Housing Department helps eligible shelter residents by providing financial support for board and lodging. Employment and Financial Support Case Coordinators also visit the shelters to take applications for Employment and Financial Support. There are approximately 75 emergency shelter beds, and four shelters in York Region</p>	<p>If you require emergency housing, you may call the shelter directly.</p>
<p>Porter Place Men's Shelter</p>	<p>Provides temporary shelter for males ages 16 years and over. In addition to basic needs, counselling and life skills programming are provided. <p>Leeder Place Emergency Family Shelter</p>	<p>Provides support to families who need temporary emergency shelter to re-establish them in appropriate community accommodation. <p>Sutton Youth Multi-Service Centre</p>	<p>Provides emergency shelter and transitional housing for males and females between the ages of 16 and 26. However simple or complex the issues – our staff can help you find and access the services and programs best able to meet your needs.</p> <p>Staff will work with clients to:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> ▪ Assess needs and develop a plan ▪ Provide counselling and crisis intervention ▪ Advocate on behalf of client for resources and supports, i.e., social assistance ▪ Complete various government applications ▪ Assist with landlord/tenant mediation and develop strategies to maintain their housing or find new housing
