How to become a CHAP Respite Provider:

1. Apply online at

2. Submit required documentation.

You will need to provide:

- A valid Police/Vulnerable Sector Screening (less than 6 months old)
- Two professional references
- Copies of any current First Aid/CPR or CPI certificate

3. Attend a CHAP Orientation Session
